Bald-Faced Hornets



Idaho does not actually have any true hornets, the Bald-Facet hornet is actually a species of yellow jacket.

The Bald-Face hornet gets its name from the characteristic white markings on its face. They are most easily identified and distinguised from other yellowjackets by their black and white coloring. They create egg shaped paper nests that can measure one by two feet in size. Nests are layered hexagonal combs covered by mottled gray paper. They can squirt or spray their vemon from the stinger into the eyes of intruders causing irritation and temporary blindness.

Bald-Faced Hornets are omnivorous. They eat meat, spiders, fruit and insects. Adults will also drink flower nectar which they feed to their larvae.

HABITAT

Bald-Faced Hornets live throughout the North America, they are usually found in forested and urban areas in trees and bushes but can occasionally be found on the side of buildings.

BEHAVIOR

Bald-Faced hornets have an agressive and defensive narure with people and this makes them dangerous. It you get to close to the nest they will swarm and sting repeatedly.
