DIET

Boxelders feed on feeds from boxelder trees as well as maple and ash trees. Although they prefer seeds they will also such juices from the leaves when seeds are not available to eat.

HABITAT

Box Elders primarily live in a boxelder, ash or maple tree, known as their host tree. Box Elders are considered to be an invasive species.

BEHAVIOR

Boxelders bugs feed and lay eggs in their host tree. They will leave the host tree and fly to warm surfaces nearby like rocks or houses. When it starts to get cold they will try to enter homes to stay warm.
